

## MINNESOTA TRANSFER CURRICULUM Saint Cloud Technical College (SCTC)

To complete the St. Cloud Technical College version of the Minnesota Transfer Curriculum, all ten-emphasis areas listed below must be completed. A total of at least 40 semester credits must be earned. Courses designated with a superscript (e.g., **BLGY 1305<sup>10</sup>**) satisfy more than one emphasis area. **Courses in bold= SCTC courses; Courses not in bold= ARCC courses offered at SCTC, Note: Credits are counted only once toward the 40-credit minimum requirement. Students must earn a minimum of 20 credits from SCTC or 12 if transferring courses from another MnSCU or U of M Campus. Students must earn a minimum 2.0 GPA in the MNTC.**
